

LETTER FROM THE FOUNDER

Dear Friends,

In the early days of Samaritan Aviation's humble beginnings, it seemed challenging to plan just two years out. For the first few years, it was just myself, Kirsten, and our three kids. We filled every role in order to make the ministry work. At times Kirsten was not just the ambulance driver, but would rush to the airport to turn on the airstrip lights when I was arriving later than planned, and gave me vital weather updates when severe tropical storms were in the area. Our family would also minister to the patients in the hospital with our kids offering food, clothes and prayer.

Here we are over 20 years later, and we can no longer plan just a year or two out and are currently setting the direction of Samaritan Aviation for the next twenty years. No longer is it just one family; by the end of this year, we will have six families serving in Papua New Guinea and our third seaplane enroute! We feel that in the coming year we have the ability to double our impact in meeting the desperate needs in two of the most remote provinces in all of Papua New Guinea!

Two things have become very evident to me as I reflected on the last 20 plus years. The first, is that where we are today as an organization could not have been possible without the prayers and support from people like you. Secondly, where we need to go as an organization will not take place unless we continue to partner together to meet the critical needs of the people living in the remote communities. Only together can we accomplish "The Mission to More" which is the theme of our next big push, to enable us to lay the foundation and much needed infrastructure for the next twenty years.

I am forever grateful for your partnership and look forward to all of us celebrating even more lives saved and becoming followers of Christ.




PAPUA NEW GUINEA

- PNG has over 8 million people along with 840 languages
- Over 250,000 people in the region are without access to the hospital
- Infant mortality rates are often as high as 40%
- Tribal communities face many challenges such as malaria, other diseases, snake bites, tuberculosis, pregnancy complications, and tribal warfare

We also have plans to expand our emergency medical flight services to the Western and Gulf Provinces, and have been invited to do so by the Minister of Health.




