Deeper Roots

Incredible opportunities are within reach for deepening the roots of Samaritan Aviation. One major milestone has already been reached: securing the hangar we previously leased. As the hub of our entire operations, and the only aviation hangar in Wewak, this facility is critical to the long-term sustainability of our ministry.

Additionally, building on the land we purchased during our last campaign, the Training Center deepens our roots by allowing for discipleship training and the ability to host mission teams from around the world. This opens new opportunities we have long been praying for to expand our impact across Papua New Guinea.

Longer Reach

With these roots, the sky is the limit. The first step in longer reach is completing the dock (seaplane lift installation), the fuel storage and aviation workshop, along with building staff houses in our expansion to the Gulf Province! This allows us to launch life-saving services in a new region where the need is urgent.

Here's why this truly matters - Every flight we make is a lifeline not only for physical healing but for eternal hope found in Christ. We invite you to join us in establishing deeper roots so we can extend a longer reach of hope for the people of Papua New Guinea.

WABAKU VILLAGE, NOV. 2025

On November 14, two-year-old Jacob fell into a fire while playing outside his home in Wabaku, suffering second-degree burns across the front of his tiny body. Miraculously, he survived the night. As soon as they could, his family called Samaritan Aviation.

Our team reached Wabaku and picked up Jacob and his father, beginning the urgent flight toward Boram Hospital. During the flight, a major storm forced the plane to land and wait it out. As soon as it was safe to fly again, the crew lifted off and completed the trip, getting Jacob to the care he desperately needed.

For three weeks, Jacob received treatment and antibiotics, slowly regaining strength. Today, he is thriving, and his father is hopeful they will return home soon. During their hospital stay, both father and son also completed the King of Glory series, learning about Christ's love and the salvation He offers.

Jacob's healing journey isn't over, but the hospital staff is optimistic about his recovery. Because of partners like you, children like Jacob receive both lifesaving medical care and the hope of the Gospel in their darkest moments.

These funds expanded aviation capacity, secured land for our future base, launched staff housing, and opened new ministry in the Gulf Province.

EAST SEPIK PROVINCE PROJECTS

- **Land for Future Homes & Operations**
Over 1.5 acres secured near Wewak for Samaritan Aviation's future base.
- **6 Staff Family Homes**
Construction began on six 4-bedroom homes for missionary families.

GULF PROVINCE EXPANSION PROJECTS

- **Additional Seaplane**
An additional aircraft secured to meet growing medical flight needs.
- **Floating Dock & Dredging Equipment**
Phase 1 dock installed and dredging equipment purchased for the Gulf base.

Deeper Roots in the East Sepik means raising \$2.44 million to move from lease to ownership.

Purchasing and building two staff homes and an office for our missionaries to thrive in the Gulf.

DEEPER ROOTS

"Deeper Roots" strengthens our capacity to reach remote communities, train local leaders, and sustain life-changing ministry across Papua New Guinea for generations to come.

To do this, we need to raise \$2,440,000.

WEWAK CONSTRUCTION | \$1,160,000

The Wewak headquarters will serve as the long-term operational and training hub for Samaritan Aviation in Papua New Guinea, strengthening leadership development, supporting staff families, and expanding aviation ministry across the region.

\$500,000

Build a two-story Training Center for leadership development and discipleship training across PNG.

\$340,000

Construct a Duplex Residence to provide long-term housing for Samaritan Aviation staff families.

\$270,000

Build two 3-bedroom residences with ensuite beneath existing homes for staff and visiting ministry teams.

\$50,000

Complete base development, including playground space, concrete pads, and other essential site improvements.



HANGAR | \$475,000

The Wewak hangar is the operational hub for all Samaritan Aviation flights in PNG. The hangar has already been secured, and the first installment toward its purchase has been paid.

To serve as a long-term aviation base, the facility now requires significant upgrades, including:

- Structural roof repairs and framing replacement
- Electrical service upgrades for safe aircraft maintenance
- Expanded hangar space to support additional aircraft
- Improvements to maintenance, flight operations, and parts storage areas

These upgrades will support Samaritan Aviation's growing fleet and ministry.



DEEPER ROOTS, LASTING IMPACT.

SEAPLANE UPGRADES | \$550,000

Keeping our seaplanes safe and reliable requires major maintenance and upgrades. This includes flying the aircraft to Australia for engine overhauls, corrosion repair, window replacements and interior refurbishments, new paint, and avionics upgrades.

MINISTRY RESOURCES | \$255,000

As our PNG team continues to grow, we are investing in medical training, ministry equipment, and additional vehicles for the East Sepik base. These resources support transportation to the hangar, hospital, and remote villages—expanding our ability to serve patients and share the Gospel.

LONGER REACH

GULF EXPANSION



God has opened new doors for ministry in the Gulf Province. Phase 2 will establish the infrastructure needed to expand life-saving flights and Gospel outreach across Papua New Guinea.

To do this, we need to raise \$1,065,000.

STAFF HOMES | \$540,000

As we expand into the Gulf, we need homes for missionary families serving there. These homes provide safety, stability, and a long-term base for ministry.

DOCK & FUEL STORAGE | \$175,000

Expanding the dock, installing an aircraft lift, and completing roof coverage will allow safe maintenance, fueling, and overnight aircraft security. Long-term aviation operations in the Gulf will depend on this infrastructure.

MINISTRY OUTREACH | \$150,000

We are equipping a Papua New Guinean team with medical training, essential tools, and Gospel resources such as audio Bibles and the King of Glory curriculum. A vehicle and small transport boat are needed to support the delivery of medical supplies and ministry outreach to remote villages.

AVIATION EXPANSION | \$200,000

Through Phase 1 support, Samaritan Aviation acquired an additional seaplane. Phase 2 funds will ship the aircraft to Papua New Guinea and complete avionics upgrades to serve the growing needs in the Gulf Province.

PAPUA NEW GUINEA THE LAST FRONTIER

Samaritan Aviation brings lifesaving medical flights to Papua New Guinea's most remote communities. Founded by Mark Palm and launched on the Sepik River in 2010, our aircraft reach places far beyond roads and runways.

We serve more than 750,000 people in the East Sepik and Gulf Provinces, turning multi-day canoe journeys into one-hour emergency flights. Partnering with Gulf Christian Services at Kapuna Hospital, we transport patients, deliver critical medical supplies, and expand access to healthcare.

Operating 365 days a year, we've completed over 3,000 emergency medevac flights and more than 300 medical life flights annually, delivering 18,000+ pounds of medical supplies. Most patients are women and children, and every flight is free through generous supporters—bringing healing, hope, and the love of Christ to those who need it most.
